

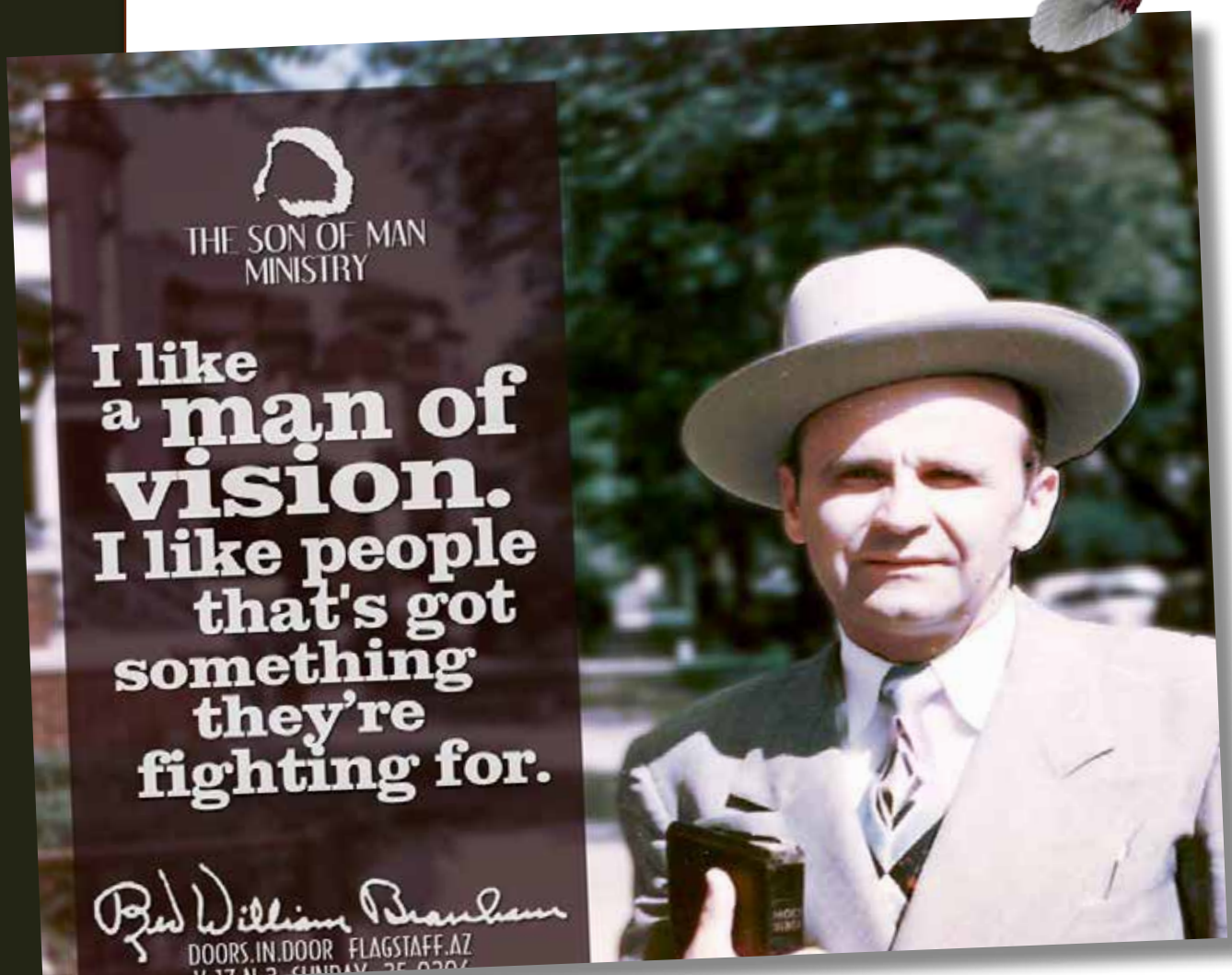

# Printing Stations: Vietnam



Brethren, God bless.

Again I just wish to give a small write-up on the missionary work going on in Vietnam that is financially supported by the readers of the BNL.

Since my article in last months BNL on Vietnam, there has been much progress made in setting up a new printing station for message books in Saigon. For security reasons all identities will remain anonymous. A picture of the double-sided printed is supplied with this article as well as the

printing process and the first book in print.

Efforts to print message books in Vietnam has been sporadic over the years because of internal politics getting in the way. It had come to a complete standstill in the past few years. The problem recently has been to find brethren that could be trusted to get the printing process operating again and remaining independent from those who love to control the supply lines.

That has now been solved and a totally reliable person is now printing the books and the first supply of the "God in Simplicity" sermon has been

printed, stapled and cut to size for mailing to the respective fellowships.

Because of the need to remain independent, books will be sent out to everybody irrespective of their "political persuasions". It is a shame that spirits find their way into the umbrella of the message and cause divisions, but that is what was prophesied from Genesis to Revelation and it should be of no surprise when we see these things materialize as the end nears.

However it is not the place of a Holy Spirit filled Christian to exacerbate a bad situation, but it is their place to make their circle of influence bigger to accommodate everybody's needs. That way nobody can say that they didn't have an opportunity when it was made available to them. Please pray for the success of this printing work as it is fraught with obstacles.

As always, if brethren desire to support the work being done in Vietnam, feel free to contact those that do missionary work there.

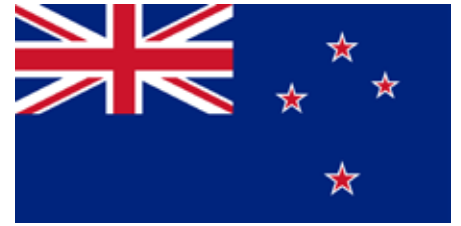

**Meetings in a Message Church in Uganda**



We founded *Believers Outreach Missions* to reach non-believers with the message of God in East Africa, promote missionary and evangelistic activities among believers and ensure there is a proactive team of associate ministers to work in the end time harvest as well supply Individuals in need with essential, spiritual necessities.

By the help and grace of God we are already doing this, though not on a big scale due to little resources. We now need message ministers from all over East Africa to partner with us, we need evangelists, apostles and teachers to help us bring the church in East Africa to maturity. We encourage pastors to place a mission box in the corner of the church and give an opportunity to the believers to give to missions as instructed by our prophet. That's one of the ways you can support us.

Put the little mission box in your churches in case you haven't. This will give a chance to the saints in your churches to give to missions. We discovered it is not easy to do evangelism or outreach missions using offerings as the offering bag already has a lot of strains, and mission work will always be given a second thought. You will also discover as we did some time ago that, many times, believers want to give to missions but there is usually no specific bag for them to do so in many of our message churches. Once you have a specific fund for lost souls you'll find it very easy to go about it. Encourage the believers to give the work of winning souls the number one priority. That's what we were commissioned to do. Building and other programs are supposed to come second.

We also need to monitor "the quick work" being done in the jungle stations of East Africa. We would like to know what the Lord is doing with your ministry. It encourages other evangelists and apostles (missionaries) to be out in the field and gives churches the morale to support the work. We appreciate when you tell us

*Yeah. Right. Charity begins at home. You see? We--we--we take care of our own needs here, 'cause we'd have... This is the church of God, or ever, your little church, the church of God. Now, if you can't even pay your pastor, you can't even get song books and things, you shouldn't be sending it somewhere else. See? But then after you got your church paid for, and everything, your debts all up and everything, fixed and ready and go on, then help that other brother that needs a little help out yonder. You see? Get a little... I believe, while... If you're making payments on your church I'd also have a little fund set somewhere for a missionary offering if the people felt like they wanted to give to missions. 'Cause a lot of people will give to missions when they won't give to home churches and things. So if they don't give it to missions, they'll spend it for something else. So I'd say just have a little mission box, not... That's the way we try to do.*

"It was Bro Branham's desire to visit East Africa even if it meant coming in as a hunter-missionary but that did not happen. Somehow the message has spread to many parts of the region and churches have been planted in almost every tiny



missionaries and hunters of souls reach all interior jungle stations of East Africa and that the existing churches are packed with born again believers.

As soldiers in a great army we have also had our share of challenges since we started this work in 2006. At one time it seemed as if this ministry would die off when certain ministers, scared that our activities would interfere with, and eventually destroy their influence on their doctrinal alliances, began to advise believers in their churches not to associate with us at all but like a fire that has been lit in a bush our activities have continued to spread. Many ministers are beginning to see the need to put aside doctrinal differences and join the efforts to reach lost souls.

Among places we have frequently visited are Busia district, Mayuge district and Namaingo district of Eastern Uganda, where we have massive missionary activities since July 2015. There is a short supply of message materials. We have on several times distributed books that have however not satisfied their thirst. There are VOGR libraries all over Kenya and Uganda, but it is mistakenly assumed that once the books arrive, they are accessible to the believers. However, most of the churches in remote jungles of East Africa are too poor to meet the costs of collecting the books. Most remote parts of Namaingo, Mayuge and Busia districts where we have been, have difficulties accessing message materials because the logistics are not working. Besides, there aren't enough books to serve them and as a matter of fact books like C.O.D and Seals, Churches Ages and other important books are not in supply. Their inability to get the message books has had an

understanding of Conduct, Order and Doctrine, so much that sometimes, visiting ministers have to abandon deep teachings and stress on C.O.D. basics. We have undertaken a series of evangelistic as well missionary visits in these places in the past. *Believers Outreach Missions* associate churches are working towards finding a rented room for a fully functional library where material can be accessed by everyone and ensure the message of the hour reaches everywhere. We have previously requested for support from message churches all over the world to send books and materials and if possible supplement our efforts by sending us some of their missionaries

### As reported by Pastor Victor Okwaro

We returned from our one week missionary trip in Samia and Busoga last weekend, preaching in Namayingo and Mayuge districts of Eastern Uganda. Below is the report.

Our team comprised of Pastor Victor Okwaro, Gilbert Ouma, of Victory Valley House Funyula, Pastor Stephen Wadeka of Sibembe, Evangelist Moses Omuyoyi of Soul Harvest Prison Ministries and Evangelist Paul Mutumba who joined us at Bugiri. We started on Easter Friday 14th April 2017 with Bumoli where we were hosted by Pastor Valiant Wesonga,

I preached on "Who put the stone over Jesus grave?" showing them that Joseph of Arimathea, a believer, who was aware that Jesus had talked about laying down his life and raising it up again, but he proceeded and put Jesus in the grave and pulled a huge stone over it as though he would not rise. Most believers have lost the vision and covered the truth in the grave with this huge stone, and forgotten the very hope of their calling. Then in the evening on Jude 11 "Beware of these three men in the message of the hour" the first one is Cain; a man without revelation, an envious man and a murderer. There is already a mark of the beast on his forehead. I predict that these are they who will betray the bride like Judas did to Jesus. The second one is Balsam, a man after reward and position, one who doesn't care about God's will as long as he gains, and finally, Core, a great preacher, a popular man who withstands the prophet of God. Jude verse 4 These three men crept in unawares and invaded the message churches.

After the meetings at Bumoli Bro Gilbert, Bro Valiant and Bro Wadeka went to a hotel in Mukolobi, a neighboring town, to get supper and as they prayed for the food, the anointing was so great that demons struck down one of the waiters. The brothers had to leave their food and cast out the demons. The incidence attracted the people around who gathered around and the brothers had a chance to preach to them for two hours. Three people, including the girl from whom demons were removed accepted Jesus Christ as their personal saviour right there.

Sunday morning we visited Buyinja prison. Then Pastor Wadeka remained with Bro Gilbert Ouma who ministered at Namayingo Church while the rest of us moved to Budola where we were hosted by Pastor Moses Waniala. I preached on "who will roll away the stone for us?" the women asked as they sought Jesus who is alive among the dead. We seek him in denominational graves of creeds and dogmas yet He is only alive in the true revelation of the Word. He has already removed the denominational barrier stone when he rose again so that we can see the light. He is no longer in those graves.

Bro Gilbert and Pastor Wadeka joined us at Budola later in the evening after Bro Moses Omuyoyi had already left for Nairobi. Bro Moses returned on Friday with message books, detergent, bar soap and tissue papers for Buyinja prison. The rest of us, Pastor Victor Okwaro, Bro Gilbert and Pastor Wadeka travelled to Bugiri where we took our Lusoga translator Evangelist Bro Mutumba and travelled to Marindi on Monday 17th April 2017.

In Malinda, on arrival we were informed of a man who has been attending fellowship with the believers was sick and bedridden for two months. For some moments we felt the spirit restraining us

from praying then suddenly the spirit of God moved through Pastor Victor Presto who asked the man to confess if there is anything that would prevent his healing. The man left us in the room without saying a word, and took some time out, causing panic, with some of us worried that maybe he had gone to look for a whip to chase us away. Afterwards, he returned with a small bottle with a concoction he was given by a witch doctor then confessed. The brothers threw the bottle in a latrine and we prayed. The man's wife is a believer and when we met her later she told us that the man had denied having gone to see a witch doctor.

We had two services on Tuesday 18th and I preached on the basic truths of the message doctrine, also stressing that when Moses the law giver died, The Lord gave a new commission and a new order to a new man, Joshua the Holy Spirit. Moses, because of glorifying himself was not allowed to take the children of Israel to the promise. But Joshua a man who had been faithfully taught by Moses takes the true message doctrine and leads God's people to the promise.

In the evening, several people came where we were staying with various problems, having heard healing testimonies from our previous visits. Among them, a lady who was raised a Muslim, and who was pregnant and still in labour in her eleventh month and another one who separated from her husband came and we prayed but we left before hearing from them. Then there was a woman who was slapped by demons and started feeling a headache, we prayed and in the morning she was fine.

The next two days, Wednesday and Thursday, we were travelling by boat to and back from Yibwe Island in Lake Victoria. We had evangelistic messages and seven people believed and were baptized on Friday by Pastor Wadeka who remained so as to encourage the believers at Malindi up-to Sunday 23rd April 2017. The rest of us returned on Friday morning.

In Yibwe so many people came in the prayer line. Among them was a little girl who had demons and the mother had tried all the witch doctors. She had also tried faith healers who only took money but nothing happened. She brought her to us and we cast out the demons. Another man whose legs were swollen such that he could hardly move came in the prayer line and a few minutes before we left to Marindi where we were staying he was seen carrying a very heavy luggage, running to catch the boat.
