From Andy's Desk

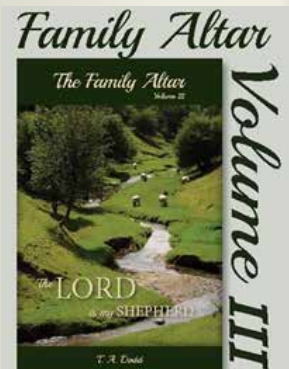

Report on Missionary Trip To Turkey December 12, 2015 to January 11, 2016



Report on Missionary Trip To Turkey December 12, 2015 to January 11, 2016

I thank God for the trip I had to Turkey and the chance to visit the saints. At the beginning of the trip I stayed in Eskisehir and spent more time with the local pastor. We discussed the doctrine and the importance of giving out the right spiritual food. I had the chance to have fellowship with him on a daily basis, and he conveyed how beneficial that was for him.

While there, I preached 5 services, as well as Sunday services wherein my main focus was on the importance of understanding the Word of God, why He sent us a prophet in this age, and the vindication of his ministry. I also talked about the difference between a real genuine Christianity and a denominational version of it. We discussed how the denominations came to exist and if it is possible for a real newborn Christian to have a false doctrine. After that, I tried to have private interviews with the saints. Since we have a local pastor in the field now, I tried to just have question and answer sessions with them instead of pastoral meetings. By God's Grace and the cooperation of the saints, we held the Christmas banquet in Eskisehir. Many denominational families attended the service and a few of them asked for contact information in order to come to the services. 5 people also came to Christ as a result of the Christmas banquet.

After the Christmas service in Eskisehir, I left for Sivas on a 9 hour bus ride to attend the Christmas service there as well. I think 130 people came to the service, most of them I met for the first time, and it was really exciting. One soul was saved during the service and many have since joined the church. By the Grace of God, we had a wonderful Sunday service, and God blessed us in a mighty way. After that, we had some private interviews with a few new families which recently came to town and joined us from another denominational church. They had many questions which we were able to answer through the Scripture, and it was encouraging for them, causing them to desire to follow the message of the hour in their hearts. We also had a meeting with a few brothers who had the burden to share the Gospel with people. We talked about the importance of the calling of God in our lives instead of emotions and our own feelings.

The next day we rented a car, ready to start another chapter on this trip. We had 6000 km ahead of us and prayed for God's protection and travelling mercies. Zonguldak was our first stop after a 6 hour drive, and we went to meet with a brother and have a service with the people right after our arrival. It was a good meeting, and we scheduled another follow up meeting with one of the brothers for the following morning as his wife was working

and couldn't make it to the service. The next morning we had a very good meeting, and they were excited and willing to live in the will of God. Unfortunately, we couldn't baptize them due to the weather conditions as well as being short on time.

After leaving the family, we went to visit another brother at his work place. It was a good meeting, and he wanted to walk in the truth of the Word. All the people we met in this city used to attend Elam church services (one of the most populated denominational churches in Turkey) before they got in touch with us.

After leaving Zonguldak, we headed to Istanbul, a 3 hour drive, and held a service right after our arrival. It was a good meeting, and one person came to Christ. After the meeting, we went to his house to meet with his family and talk more about the plan of salvation with them. It was a blessed time as we discussed the plan of salvation, real life in Christ, and the importance of understanding the true teaching of the Bible. The following day, we left Istanbul for Bolu. We arrived in the afternoon and immediately scheduled a church service for the same evening. God opened the door for us to meet with two families there, and one person came to Christ. Two more people received the booklet Rade Pa, (God's footprints in the plan of salvation), and we shared the Gospel with them. It is exciting to see how God deals with people's lives.



The next day we left for Afyun and had

two services in two nights. We couldn't meet with all the saints there as they were working late hours, but one soul was saved during our visit. We had the opportunity to talk about the Christendom and how they shifted away from the word of God and adopted the doctrine of men instead of the word of God.

The next day we drove 3 hours to Isparta for Sunday service. When we got there, we noticed that the power had gone out. There was no electricity in the whole building and therefore, there was no heat as well. We started the service cold and in the dark, but God blessed us, and we had a wonderful time in his Presence. I spoke on the reason of the existence of denominations and the manifested truth to this age. I felt they really needed it because when I asked some of them if we should be proud of the protestant doctrine, surprisingly many said Amen, so I felt it was needed to talk more about the manifested word of the hour. After the service, I had some fellowship with the pastor, encouraging him to be busy and focused on the word of God.

The following day we left for Antalya, as we were scheduled to meet with a family there. It was snowing as we left, and along the way, we were driving behind a huge truck when suddenly something fell from the truck and caused brother Hamed to lose control of the car. We slipped across the road, onto the shoulder, and off the road. It was God's protection that our car did not roll over. We had to change the tire, causing us to arrive with a 3 hour delay. However, after we arrived, we could see why the devil was trying to stop us from going there as we had a wonderful time in the presence of the Lord, and people were very receptive. They are now hooking up with brother Hamed through Skype every Sunday and are growing in the word of God.

From there we went to Denizli where I had already contacted the local pastor to gather those brothers who have the burden to be in the service of the Lord for a meeting so we could discuss God's plan for this hour. Unfortunately, when I started the meeting, I realized that just one out of the ten people in the meeting was mature enough to minister, and he was already serving the Lord. The rest needed to learn why we should believe in the Bible and why we believe the Bible to be the word of God. We had a 3 hour meeting and it went well. I think they received the answers to all of their questions, but more time is needed to have these kinds of meetings with them. I asked the mature brother to meet us in the lobby the next morning, and we talked



about the redemptive plan of God for humanity. He was very excited and said he wanted to spend more time praying and meditating on the Word. Afterward, we had a meeting with brother Shahin, the pastor there, discussing people's viewpoints of the Bible and how to deliver the right spiritual food to the flock.

From there we went to see the new church facility that they had recently leased. It was a nice place and I liked it. We had an afternoon service, and I spoke about the true and false prophet. It took a bit longer, but people were listening very closely. After the service, I asked the brothers we had met yesterday how they

were feeling today, and they testified that they felt much better after the meeting we had had yesterday. After the meeting, we went to the pastor's house where we fellowshiped with his family and discussed the topic of a true and false pastor. It was a wonderful time with them.

After that, we returned to Eskisehir and held two more services. Brother Hamed took one of the services and spoke on trust. He preached that we should always put our trust in the Lord even when we don't understand his promises or His will. But since we have faith, we trust in Him, as He is our God and He is in control of everything. This was a blessing, and I really enjoyed it. For Sunday service I spoke on the fivefold ministries and women preachers. Since there were many people in the service, I felt it was necessary for them to understand the ministries and their position in the body of Christ. Since we did not have much time, I was not able to cover the fivefold ministries as I would have liked to do, so instead, I focused more on why we do not believe in women preachers and what role sisters do have in the body.

I am thankful for all we've seen on this trip. I might've failed to remember many of the events, but I am sure that God has seen them all. May God bless all those who are standing with us in this path. May God's Grace and Mercy be to each and everyone. Amen.

Secrets of the Pyramid.

David Shearer.

Part 2.

This is not a spiritual article. It is a continuation of some facts about the Great Pyramid of Egypt, that we hope you find interesting. (Part 1 was in our February 2016 issue)

Ancient Theodolite.

In 1880 an Australian surveyor, Robert Ballard, was in a train passing the pyramids. He realized that a person could obtain an accurate line anywhere within sight of the pyramids, by using nothing more than a weight and string, and sighting the peak of the pyramid and the sun.

When the Nile flooded, the boundaries of the farmland, and the surrounding country were obliterated. These could be quickly surveyed using the sun, the pyramids, and string and a weight.

Ballard suggested that the smaller pyramid might have been sheathed in red granite, allowing it to stand out in contrast to the other two, providing another way of line sighting.

Construction.

It is a free standing stone structure. There is no mortar used and no steel reinforcing, quite a feat, considering it is as high as a modern forty story building.

It contains more than two and a half million blocks of limestone and granite, that weigh between 2 and 70 tons each.

Ancient historians have claimed that the pyramid was sheathed in polished limestone which was inscribed with writing and symbols.

In order to prevent the pyramid from falling apart because of its tremendous weight, the stone blocks in each of the corners are "keyed" into "sockets" in the rock of the Giza site. Apart from these sockets the pyramid's base on the Giza site is flat to within a

sixteenth of an inch over 13 acres.

Internal Passages.

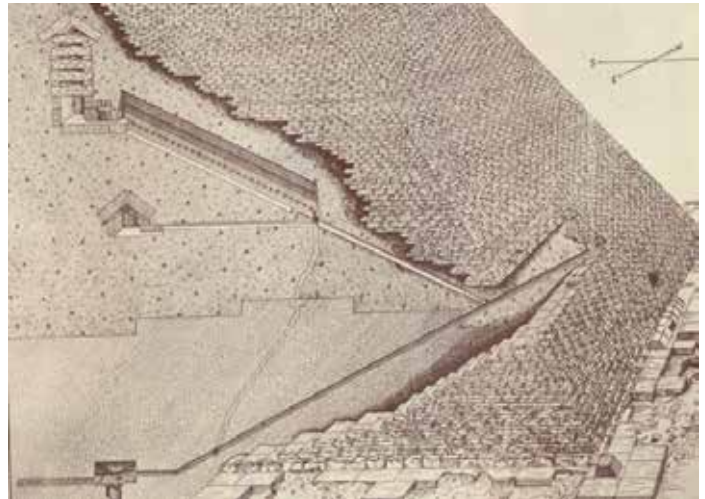


Diagram of (known) internal passages.

There was once a pivoting stone covering the entrance to what is called the Descending Passage, which is at an angle of $26\frac{1}{2}$ degrees and goes to a pit underneath the pyramid. Another passage, the Ascending passage, exactly at an angle of $26\frac{1}{2}$ degrees, climbs off this passage until it reaches a junction of a horizontal passage which goes to a room called the "Queens chamber", and a high section of passage (seven stepped walls) called the "Grand gallery". At the end of the Grand gallery there is a passage to the "King's chamber" but it requires a ladder to reach it (rapture?). The passages are lined with polished limestone and have been created at this exact angle, by sighting a certain star present at the time of construction. The upwards passage, achieved by reflecting the starlight in a pool of water at the junction of Descending and Ascending passages.

The Grand gallery is 157 feet long, the walls are 28 feet high narrowing in seven steps, such that it is 62 inches wide at the base, but 41 inches at the top. It is inclined at the same angle $-26\frac{1}{2}$ degrees, as the ascending and descending passages.

THE LORD'S MONEY.

When doing missionary work you often get entrusted with differing quantities of money for various purposes. Some could be used for message materials, some for building projects, and some for relief as a result of climatic upheavals. But no matter what the quantity or what the purpose is, the bottom line is that it is "the Lord's money" that you are using.

Over the years you become very experienced in understanding human nature and the vagaries that is carried with that. You get to meet the mixed multitudes who can present a seemingly authentic outward appearance of being Christians when inside them are motives that are quite the opposite. Then you meet those who are sincere but have weaknesses that must be guarded lest they fall into temptations especially in connection with money. The missionary – or anyone entrusted with money – must put into place checks and balances so that the "Lord's money" goes towards the "Lord's purposes".

When guarding the distribution of donations it is easy to offend people. You could end up hearing "you don't trust me" or "I'm your brother" or "don't you know I'm a minister" or "I have been a Christian for umpteen years" and so on. The best way to avoid offending brethren is to issue a standard set of procedures irrespective of who or how people see themselves in their own eyes.

Before I send any donations into a nation I require that a bank account is set up and all funds are placed into that account for traceability. Then at least 2 trustees are set up over that account that requires at least 2 signatories for withdrawals. All transactions must have receipts kept in storage and cop-

ies posted or emailed back to me so that the donors can see that their love offerings have been "used for the Love of the Lord". If possible, never place cash into anybody's hands irrespective of their ministerial status as not all ministers are born-again!!!

You may right now be saying "Brother you sure are a hard operator". No I'm not actually. If donations are squandered, stolen, misappropriated or used for exaggerated purposes when I know it could have been avoided, then I am guilty of being a wasteful steward. If I place temptations in the face of those with monetary weaknesses then I place them in a dangerous position before the Lord.

Too many times I have seen money ruin lives because of misplaced trust. My eyes have seen people go unto judgment because the good intentions of Christians have placed cash into the hands of the morally weak. If wisdom was used in the first place these calamities would not have happened.

Should you donate to the mission fields? Yes, by all means. "Get all you can and give all you can" to quote John Wesley. But find someone that understands the "spirits of nations" and how they operate so that your donations are used for the Kingdom of God. It isn't difficult to do things properly

South Africa Trip Report November 28 - December 4, 2015

We flew out from the Greater Cincinnati airport Wednesday afternoon November 28th, 2015 and arrived in Cape Town Thursday night around 11 pm. The trip took over 26 hours of travel time. We were greeted at the airport by a contingent of pastors and brethren who were waiting for our arrival.



Sister LaVonne was presented a bouquet of flowers by Pastor Pascal Okitowamba's 12 year old daughter's. Pastor Okitowamba was our host for the ministers convention. He is pictured in the last row in the middle right

in front of Pastor Harold Beckett who also hosted us and was a gracious host as well.

Pastor Beckett took us to our hotel, where we arrived after midnight. We did not get much sleep that night as we had a wakeup call at 7:30 to begin our day.



Our schedule called for a 10 am ministers meeting, which began late and went until 3:30 pm.



The ministers meetings were attended by about 20 ministers, and this first day we discussed the difference between the Father and son, and went into the importance of understanding the relationship that Jesus had with His Father so that we also might enter into the same. Afterwards we went to Pastor Pascal's home



where we had supper with his family, and then relaxed a couple hours until we had to leave for the 6 pm evening service. There were more than 100 people in attendance as well as 16 ministers, and Br. Brian spoke on the subject, "The Faith of the Son of God from Gethsemane to the Cross."

Saturday morning we again met with the ministers at 10 am, and we met until 2 pm. We discussed the Adoption and being conformed to the Image of the firstborn son, the Manifestation of sons, etc. Saturday evening we again began at 6pm and continued until 10:30 pm. Br. Brian spoke on the subject "without Christ we have nothing". The people were truly blessed.



The services lasted much longer than a normal service in the United States because most of the ministers were from Congo DRC who now live in



South Africa and pastor here. These are French Speaking brethren and therefore each service was translated into French. we also held a prayer line after Saturday night service.

Brethren traveled to be with us in these meetings from as far away as Eastern Congo DRC, and Johannesburg South Africa a 14.5 hour drive, and several others cities within a half a days drive including Cape Town Itself. we appreciate so much the effort on everyone's part to make these meetings a success.



Sunday Morning we held regular Sunday morning worship service at 10 am and Br. Brian Spoke on the Adoption and Inheritance of the saints. We finished the Sunday morning service and the ministers went immediately upstairs where we held a



questions and answers session while several wives watched on. We then prayed for two thirds of the ministers who attended the meetings. At 3:45 we closed the ministers Q and A session, and Brother Abraham drove us to the hotel to get ready for our evening service with Br. Harold Beckett and his church.



There we spoke on the subject "without Christ we have lost everything".

The reception was extremely well, and I would say based upon the



reaction to the Word preached this Church has been taught very well. Brother Beckett was a tremendous host and very kind. May God bless him richly.



Durban South Africa Meetings December 1 and 2nd, 2015



We left Cape Town Monday and flew to Durban and were received by Mark Bailey and His family along with Br. Namy Naidoo a local pastor who agreed to host the meetings. Tuesday morning Br. Namy picked us up and took us to the hotel where

brother Branham stayed when he was in Durban and where the trucks of crutches and chairs left over from the meetings at the race track. The picture is right behind us and has been since renovated leaving off the balconies that were present at the time of BR. Branham's trip in 1952.



After visiting the hotel we traveled to the race track to see where brother Branham had preached to such a large crowd of several hundred thousand believers. The picture below is from the original condition where brother Branham came out

onto the balcony to see the parade of people and dozen plus trucks filled with medical equipment left at the track after all the people were healed.

We then drove to the race track to see how large the place was. actually the grounds include a golf course which has lots of grass where the people were able to sit during the healing campaign.



There were to be two minister meetings on Tuesday and a break in between



for lunch, however because of the interest we kept going through the lunch break and continued from 2 pm until 9 pm. We cover the difference between the father and son and focused on that relationship that Jesus had with his Father, and how every son is invited into that same relationship with the father.

Wednesday morning we took a trip to the Indian Ocean and placed our feet into it. Symbolic, I don't know, but it was very pleasant.

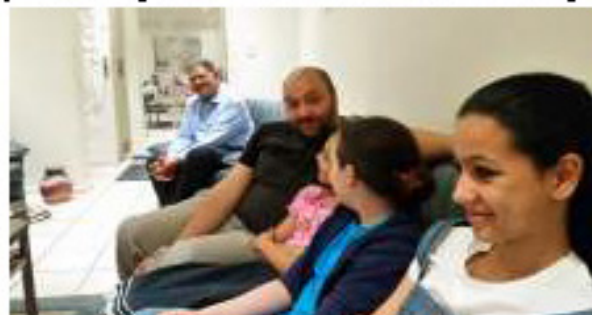
We stopped at br. Namy and sister Premie's favorite spice shop on the way to the airport, and we were

It went on for two years. I told myself I'm not giving up. I'm not turning from God again. Then saints I had my last heart attack. This time it was so severe that the doctors said that I won't make it. I needed a heart. I waited for over a year for someone to die with a matching heart. Then I asked a brother Ron to pray for me so I could get a heart from somewhere. I had faith in God.

Two months after I asked for prayer, and I know I've been prayed for all over the world, I went for some cardiac test. Listen to this. The doctors wanted to know. "When did you get a heart transplant? There is nothing wrong with your heart now. Its brand new!" I smiled and said. "God gave me a new heart.

No operation needed. Praise God. Hallelujah! My faith in Him made me well. The wife didn't care at all. She went on with her things. She became so addicted to the tablets. It started to harm her organs. One morning she didn't wake up. I cried as I do now writing this.

Saints learn from me...please don't let lust rule you. What I went through must be a lesson. Don't marry outside the camp. You can't save your partner. God does the saving. If they're not made for the message then they won't accept it. Don't be fooled or misled. Please don't say after we are married I'll bring her to believe. SHE WON'T. Nor will HE. God calls! Not you! Today I'm free to love. Never will I ever see lust for love. If you need a lifetime partner, ask God. He will give you what you need and not what you want. It was good that we didn't have children. I thank God today that I can tell young people my experience in marriage with the wrong partner. This time God has blessed me with a sister in the message. If its the Lords will, we will get married in May 2012. God bless saints. I hope that my testimony will be of use to someone out there.
